

Explanations	
1. B	It is on topic and asks for a detail you need.
2. A	It asks about a detail the speaker just said.
3. B	Asking questions helps you understand the topic better.
4. B	Waiting for a pause is polite and helps everyone listen.
5. C	The word who is used to ask about a person.
6. B	The word when is used to ask about a time.
7. A	Repeating the time back helps you check you heard it right.
8. A	It asks for more about what the classmate said.
9.	Answer: Example: How big is the blue whale? Accept any reasonable how-question about the topic.
10.	Answer: Example: What did you do at the beach? Accept any question that asks about the classmate's statement.
