<b>1. B</b>	It is on topic and asks for a detail you need.
<b>2. A</b>	It asks about a detail the speaker just said.
<b>3. B</b>	Asking questions helps you understand the topic better.
<b>4. B</b>	Waiting for a pause is polite and helps everyone listen.
<b>5. C</b>	The word who is used to ask about a person.
<b>6. B</b>	The word when is used to ask about a time.
<b>7. A</b>	Repeating the time back helps you check you heard it right.
<b>8. A</b>	It asks for more about what the classmate said.
<b>9.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: How big is the blue whale? Accept any reasonable how-question about the topic.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: What did you do at the beach? Accept any question that asks about the classmate's statement.



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
