## Quick Review

The same story can be told in different ways. When you compare two versions, look for what is the same and what is different.

### PART 1 — READ

Read the passage. Then answer the questions.

## Two Tellings of The Tortoise and the Hare

Version 1: A fast hare laughed at a slow tortoise. 'You could never beat me in a race,' he said. They began to race. The hare ran far ahead, then stopped to take a nap. The tortoise kept walking, slow and steady. The tortoise passed the sleeping hare and won the race.

Version 2: A speedy rabbit teased a turtle by a pond. 'Race me if you dare!' she said. The race began near an old barn. The rabbit zoomed ahead, then sat down to eat carrots. The turtle moved on, step by step. The turtle reached the finish line first and won.

Both stories tell about a fast animal and a slow animal in a race. In both, the fast animal stops along the way, and the slow animal wins. The two stories use different animals and different places, but they teach the same lesson.

<b>1. A</b>	Both stories tell about a fast animal racing a slow animal.
<b>2. B</b>	Version 1 has a hare and a tortoise.
<b>3. B</b>	Version 2 has a rabbit and a turtle.
<b>4. B</b>	In Version 1, the hare stops to take a nap.
<b>5. B</b>	In Version 2, the rabbit sits down to eat carrots.
<b>6. B</b>	The versions use different animals and different places.
<b>7. B</b>	In both stories, the slow animal wins the race.
<b>8. T</b>	The last paragraph says both stories teach the same lesson.
