<b>1. B</b>	A science book about plants gives facts that answer the question.
<b>2. B</b>	It is short and tells a clear fact about plants.
<b>3. B</b>	Short keywords help you write fast and find ideas later.
<b>4. A</b>	What you have seen or done can be a real source.
<b>5. B</b>	Looking outside gives you facts about today's weather.
<b>6. B</b>	It keeps the main fact in a few short words.
<b>7. B</b>	Looking up the word helps you understand the fact.
<b>8. T</b>	Short notes are easier to write and read later.
<b>9. notes</b>	Notes are short words that help you remember facts.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: Question: What do rabbits eat? Fact: Rabbits eat grass and vegetables. Accept any clear question with one fact that answers it.



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
