Animals in Winter

Winter can be cold and hard for animals. Food is hard to find when snow covers the ground. Animals have special ways to stay alive in winter. Some animals sleep. Some animals move away. Some animals stay and find a way to keep warm.

Some animals sleep all winter long. This long sleep is called hibernation. Bears, frogs, and groundhogs hibernate. They eat a lot of food in the fall. Then they sleep in a warm den until spring. Their bodies use the stored food to live.

Other animals move to warmer places. This trip is called migration. Many birds fly south where the weather is warm. They can find food there. When spring comes, the birds fly back home again.
