A PREFIX is a word part added to the START of a word. It changes the word's meaning. **un-** means not (unkind). **re-** means again (redo). **pre-** means before (preview). **dis-** means not (dislike).


Explanations

1. B	The prefix un- means not. So unhappy means not happy.
2. C	The prefix re- means again. So redo means do again.
3. B	The prefix pre- means before. Preschool comes before regular school.
4. B	The prefix dis- means not. So dislike means not like.
5. B	The prefix un- means not. Unsafe means not safe.
6. B	The prefix re- means again. Retell means tell again.
7. unkind	un- + kind = unkind, which means not kind.
8. again	The prefix re- means again, as in redo and reread.
9. B	Preheat uses pre-, which means before.
10.	Answer: Example: re- + read = reread. Reread means to read again. Accept any real word with a prefix and a correct meaning.
