## Quick Review

When you read aloud, read the words ACCURATELY, at a smooth RATE that is not too fast or too slow, and with EXPRESSION. Let your voice rise for a question, sound excited for an exclamation, and pause at commas and periods.

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Explanations	
<b>1. B</b>	The exclamation mark shows strong feeling, so this line should sound loud and excited.
<b>2. A</b>	A question ends with a rising voice, so your voice should go up at the end.
<b>3. A</b>	A comma signals a short pause, so the reader should pause for a moment.
<b>4. A</b>	Reading with accuracy means saying the words correctly.
<b>5. B</b>	A good rate is smooth and steady, much like the way you talk.
<b>6. B</b>	The friends are cheering, so the line should be read in a happy, cheering voice.
<b>7. T</b>	When you read too fast, listeners may miss the words and the meaning.
<b>8. A</b>	A period ends a thought, so the reader pauses and lets the voice rest.
<b>9. C</b>	An exclamation mark shows strong feeling and calls for an excited voice.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: I would read "Great job, Sam!" in an excited and happy voice because of the exclamation mark. Accept any sentence from the passage with a tone that matches the punctuation and meaning.



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
