
Explanations

1. B	An orange has lots of juice, so it is juicy. The others are dry.
2. B	A warm bed with soft blankets feels cozy.
3. A	Honey is sticky. The others are not.
4. B	A playground full of kids is noisy.
5. B	A kitten has soft fur, so it is fluffy.
6. A	A chilly day is cold, so you wear a warm jacket.
7. A	A new coin gleams, so it is shiny.
8.	Answer: Example: a carrot, an apple, a chip, a cracker. Accept any food that makes a crunch when you bite it.
9.	Answer: Example: a warm bed, a soft chair by the fire, a blanket fort. Accept any warm, soft, comfortable place.
10.	Answer: Example: The watermelon was so juicy that it dripped down my hand. Accept any sentence that connects the word to a real-life thing.



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
