## Quick Review

When someone reads a text aloud, listen for the main idea and the details. After listening, you can retell the key ideas in your own words.

Bees are small insects that do a very big job. They live together in a home called a hive. Inside the hive there can be thousands of bees, and they all work as a team.

Bees fly from flower to flower to find a sweet liquid called nectar. They carry the nectar back to the hive. Inside the hive, the bees turn the nectar into honey. Honey is food for the bees, and people like to eat it too.

When bees move from flower to flower, they also carry tiny yellow dust called pollen. Pollen helps flowers and plants make seeds and grow. This is why bees are so important to gardens and farms.
