<b>1. B</b>	The word library should be spelled library.
<b>2. A</b>	It is a telling sentence, so it needs a period.
<b>3. A</b>	A name like Max should start with a capital letter.
<b>4. C</b>	Adding details makes the sentence stronger and clearer.
<b>5. B</b>	Revising means changing ideas to make writing better.
<b>6. A</b>	Editing means fixing capitals, punctuation, and spelling.
<b>7. C</b>	It is about a bike, not cats, so it does not belong.
<b>8. B</b>	Joining the ideas with and makes one clear sentence.
<b>9. T</b>	Reading aloud helps you hear errors and fix them.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: My dog Rex likes to run. Accept a rewrite that capitalizes My and Rex and adds a period.



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
