
Explanations

1. B	The word library should be spelled library.
2. A	It is a telling sentence, so it needs a period.
3. A	A name like Max should start with a capital letter.
4. C	Adding details makes the sentence stronger and clearer.
5. B	Revising means changing ideas to make writing better.
6. A	Editing means fixing capitals, punctuation, and spelling.
7. C	It is about a bike, not cats, so it does not belong.
8. B	Joining the ideas with and makes one clear sentence.
9. T	Reading aloud helps you hear errors and fix them.
10.	Answer: Example: My dog Rex likes to run. Accept a rewrite that capitalizes My and Rex and adds a period.



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
