In the second picture, Ella is digging a deep hole in the sand. Sand is flying everywhere. Her face shows a big smile. A small crab peeks out of the hole. The words say, 'Ella found a surprise.'

In the third picture, Ella sits next to a tall sandcastle with shells on top. The crab sits near her feet. The sun is setting, and the sky is orange and pink. The words say, 'It was a perfect day.'
