Q Quick Review

We can **add** lengths to find a total, and **subtract** lengths to find what is left or how much longer. If you put two pieces of string end to end, you **add** their lengths. If you **cut off** part of a ribbon, you **subtract** to find what is left. Word clues help: *in all*, *altogether*, and *total* mean add; *left*, *cut off*, and *how much longer* mean subtract. Always keep the unit in your answer.

◇ **Example:** A ribbon is 25 cm. You cut off 9 cm. How long is it now?

⇒ The words “cut off” tell us to subtract. We start with the whole ribbon, which is 25 cm. Then we take away the 9 cm that was cut off: $25 - 9 = 16$. The ribbon that is left is 16 cm long.

Answer: 16 cm

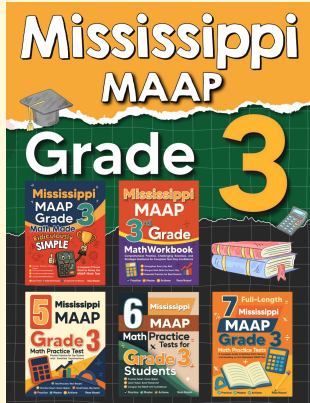
Step-by-Step Explanations

| <p>1. "Cut off" means subtract: $25 - 9 = 16$ cm.</p> <p>2. Add the two strings: $14 + 13 = 27$ inches.</p> <p>3. Subtract what is used: $30 - 12 = 18$ feet.</p> <p>4. Add the two ribbons: $16 + 8 = 24$ cm.</p> <p>5. "Cut off" means subtract: $40 - 15 = 25$ cm.</p> <p>6. Add the two pieces: $22 + 19 = 41$ inches.</p> <p>7. Add the hoses end to end: $50 + 20 = 70$ feet.</p> <p>8. Losing a piece means subtract: $17 - 6 = 11$ cm.</p> <p>9. Add the two paths: $35 + 25 = 60$ feet.</p> <p>10. "Cut off" means subtract: $48 - 23 = 25$ cm.</p> <p>11. Add the two boards: $18 + 24 = 42$ inches.</p> <p>12. Subtract what is walked: $60 - 45 = 15$ feet.</p> | <p>13. Add all three sticks: $5 + 7 + 4 = 16$ cm.</p> <p>14. "Cut off" means subtract: $33 - 14 = 19$ inches.</p> <p>15. Add the two ropes: $26 + 26 = 52$ feet.</p> <p>16. Subtract what is used: $55 - 30 = 25$ cm.</p> <p>17. Add the two straws: $9 + 13 = 22$ cm.</p> <p>18. Subtract the part knocked down: $70 - 25 = 45$ feet.</p> <p>19. Tying strings together means we add their lengths: $28 + 19 = 47$ centimeters.</p> <p>22. Using tape means we subtract: $60 - 25 = 35$ inches are left.</p> <p>23.
