Q Quick Review

A whole day has 24 hours, but a clock only shows 12 numbers. To tell the two halves of the day apart, we use **A.M.** and **P.M.** **A.M.** is the time from midnight until noon — the morning hours, when you wake up and eat breakfast. **P.M.** is the time from noon until midnight — the afternoon, evening, and night hours. A good way to remember: if the sun is coming up or it is morning, think A.M.; if it is afternoon or dark out, think P.M.

◇ **Example:** You eat lunch at 12:00 in the middle of the day. Is that A.M. or P.M.?
 ⇒ Let's think about when lunch happens. Lunch is in the middle of the day, right at noon. A.M. is before noon, and P.M. starts at noon and goes through the afternoon. Since noon is the start of P.M., lunch at 12:00 in the middle of the day is P.M.

Answer: P.M.

| 1. Waking up for school happens in the morning, so it is A.M. | 14. After school is in the afternoon, so it is P.M. |
| 2. Dinner in the evening is after noon, so it is P.M. | 15. Getting ready for school happens in the morning, so it is A.M. |
| 3. Breakfast happens in the morning, so it is A.M. | 16. A bedtime story at night is after noon, so it is P.M. |
| 4. Bedtime at night is after noon, so it is P.M. | 17. Morning class is before noon, so it is A.M. |
| 5. Sunrise happens in the morning, so it is A.M. | 18. The sunset happens in the evening, after noon, so it is P.M. |
| 6. After school is in the afternoon, which is after noon, so it is P.M. | 19. Early morning is before noon, so it is A.M. |
| 7. Before school is in the morning, so it is A.M. | 20. The afternoon is after noon, so it is P.M. |
| 8. Nighttime is after noon, so it is P.M. | 21. Waking up and eating cereal happens in the morning, before noon. So the time is 7:30 A.M. |
