Q Quick Review

Shapes are all around us! A **flat shape** is named by counting its **sides** and **corners** (also called **angles**). A **triangle** has 3 sides and 3 corners. A **quadrilateral** has 4 sides and 4 corners — squares and rectangles are quadrilaterals. A **pentagon** has 5 sides, a **hexagon** has 6 sides. Solid shapes are different: a **cube** has 6 flat faces, and a **sphere** is round like a ball. When you draw a shape, just make sure it has the right number of sides!

◇ **Example:** A shape has 4 sides and 4 corners. Name one shape it could be.

⇒ Let's think about the sides. A shape with 4 sides is called a quadrilateral. A square is a special quadrilateral with 4 equal sides and 4 corners. A rectangle also has 4 sides and 4 corners. So a shape with 4 sides and 4 corners could be a square or a rectangle. Counting the sides tells us the name!

Answer: a square (or rectangle)

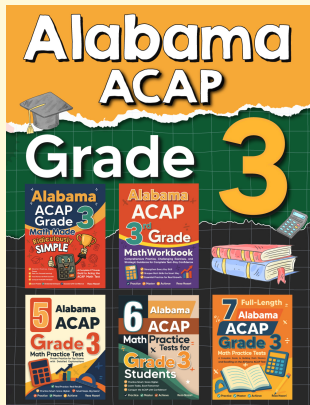
Step-by-Step Explanations

| <p>1. A triangle always has exactly 3 straight sides.</p> <p>2. A triangle has 3 corners, one where each pair of sides meets.</p> <p>3. A square has 4 sides, and they are all the same length.</p> <p>4. A square has 4 corners, one at each place two sides meet.</p> <p>5. A rectangle has 4 sides, so it is a quadrilateral.</p> <p>6. A 5-sided shape is a pentagon. Think of 5 for “pent.”</p> <p>7. A 6-sided shape is a hexagon, like the cells in a beehive.</p> <p>8. A 3-sided shape is a triangle. “Tri” means three.</p> <p>9. A hexagon has exactly 6 straight sides.</p> <p>10. A pentagon has 5 sides and 5 corners that match.</p> <p>11. When all 4 sides are the same length, the shape is a square.</p> <p>12. “Quad” means four, so a quadrilateral has 4 sides.</p> <p>13. A cube is a solid shape with 6 flat square faces.</p> <p>14. A sphere is perfectly round, like a ball or an orange.</p> | <p>15. A hexagon has 6 corners to match its 6 sides.</p> <p>16. Compare 3 and 4: since $4 > 3$, the square has more sides.</p> <p>17. A circle is a flat round shape with no straight sides or corners.</p> <p>18. A pentagon has 5 sides and a triangle has 3; $5 - 3 = 2$.</p> <p>19. A rectangle has 4 sides but the sides are not all equal.</p> <p>20. A hexagon has 6 sides and a triangle has 3; $6 + 3 = 9$.</p> <p>21. A flat shape has the same number of corners as sides. Since the octagon has 8 sides, it also has 8 corners.</p> <p>22. A cube has 6 flat square faces. A sphere has no flat faces at all — it is round like a ball.</p> <p>23. A triangle has 3 corners and a pentagon has 5 corners. Add them: $3 + 5 = 8$ corners.</p> <p>24. A square and a rectangle each have 4 sides, but a triangle has only 3 sides. Noah named the triangle by mistake.</p> |
