Quick Review

An **ABSTRACT** noun names an idea or feeling — something you can't touch — like *love*, *freedom*, *kindness*, or *fear*. A **CONCRETE** noun names something you can touch — *chair*, *dog*, *water*.

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Explanations	
1. B	Happiness is a feeling — you can't touch it. The others are concrete things.
2. C	A shoe is something you can touch and see. The others are ideas/feelings.
3. B	Kindness is an idea. The others name concrete objects.
4. B	Joy, courage, and hope are all ideas/feelings. The others are concrete objects.
5. A	Bravery is a quality/idea. Puppy and river are concrete; saved is a verb.
6. B	Joy is a feeling — the only abstract noun choice. The others are concrete.
7. C	Water is concrete. The others (friendship, honesty, patience) are abstract.
8.	Answer: Examples: love, fear, anger, joy, sadness, hope, peace, surprise, pride. Any feeling word.
9.	Answer: Examples: freedom, fairness, friendship, knowledge, honesty, justice. Any idea-based abstract noun.
10. B	Kindness, courage, and honesty describe the person's character. The others describe looks, actions, or concrete things.



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
