<b>2. A</b>	Describe = give details that help a reader picture it.
<b>3. B</b>	Explain = give a clear how/why.
<b>4. A</b>	Identify = point out / name.
<b>5. B</b>	Habitat = home/place where it lives.
<b>6. B</b>	Citizen = member of a country.
<b>7. B</b>	Estimate = a reasonable guess. Counting exactly is not estimating.
<b>8. A</b>	Analyze/summarize/predict are common in academic directions.
<b>9. B</b>	Photosynthesis belongs to science. The others are general words.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: If a question asks me to summarize, I would write the main idea and the most important details in my own words. Accept any clear explanation of the chosen academic action.



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
