Explanations	
1. C	Capitalize first and last words and important words; “in” and “the” inside the title stay lowercase.
2. A	Both important words capitalized.
3. C	First word + important words capitalized; “to” and “the” stay lowercase.
4. B	Capitalize first word (A) and important words (Day, Park); “at” and “the” stay lowercase.
5. C	And is a short connecting word that stays lowercase in the middle of titles.
6.	Answer: The Tale of Peter Rabbit First, last, and important words capitalized; “of” lowercase.
7. Finding Nemo	Both words are important.
8. C	“Of” and “a” should be lowercase: Diary of a Wimpy Kid.
9. B	First word capitalized + important words; “to” and “your” are handled correctly (your is a possessive and gets capitalized in titles).
10.	Answer: The Road Not Taken All important words capitalized; “the” (first) capitalized; “not” counts as important.
