

<b>6.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Sam was born on April 22, 2018, in Denver, Colorado. Commas between day-year and city-state, plus after the year when more text follows.
<b>7. C</b>	Capitalize month, comma between day and year.
<b>8.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> 456 Oak Lane, Phoenix, Arizona Comma after street, after city.
<b>9. B</b>	Commas after city, after state, and between day and year.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: I visited Orlando, Florida, on December 20, 2025. Any correctly punctuated sentence with city, state, and date.



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
