Quick Review

COMPARATIVE words compare TWO things and end in -er (taller, faster). SUPERLATIVE words compare THREE OR MORE and end in -est (tallest, fastest). For long words, use MORE or MOST (more careful, most careful).

Explanations	
1. A	Taller is the comparative for two people. The others are wrong forms.
2. C	Fastest = superlative (compares 3 or more).
3. C	Double the consonant before -er: bigger.
4. B	Use “more” for longer adjectives. The others are wrong forms.
5. C	Best is the irregular superlative of good (compares 3+).
6. B	Use -er, not “more” + -er. C uses “more” with a one-syllable word; D uses superlative incorrectly.
7. C	Easy → easiest (drop y, add iest). The others use wrong forms.
8. heavier	Heavy → heavier (drop y, add ier).
9. tallest	Tall → tallest.
10. B	Adverbs ending in -ly use “more” for the comparative.
11. B	Don’t double the superlative. Should be “the loudest noise.” The others are correct.
12. C	Of three or more → superlative (tallest).
