Quick Review

When someone reads aloud to you, listen for what the text is **MOSTLY** about (main idea) and the **FACTS** that support it. Listen the whole way through before deciding.

PART 1 — READ

Read the passage. Then answer the questions.

To be read aloud by an adult — The Story of the Owl

Owls are quiet hunters of the night. They have huge eyes that can see in very low light. Even though their eyes are large, owls cannot move them side to side. To look around, an owl turns its whole head.

Most owls hunt small animals like mice and bugs. They have soft feathers, so they can fly without making much sound. This helps them surprise their food. Then, with sharp claws called talons, they catch and carry their meal back to a safe place.

Owls live in many places — forests, fields, deserts, and even cities. Each kind of owl has a special call. Some hoot, some screech, and some bark. Many people enjoy listening for owl calls on quiet nights.

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Explanations	
1. B	The passage covers vision, flight, food, and habitat of owls. The others are not the focus.
2. B	The passage says owls have huge eyes that cannot move, so they turn their heads.
3. B	Soft feathers help silent flight. The others are not in the passage.
4. B	B covers the whole talk. The others contradict the read-aloud or shrink it.
5. A	Talons are mentioned. B is the opposite; C and D contradict the text.
6.	Answer: Example: Owls are silent night hunters that have big eyes, sharp talons, and live in many places. Accept any sentence that captures the overall idea.
7. B	Full listening = better understanding. The others lead to mistakes.
8. B	Listening for details lets you correct misunderstandings.
9.	Answer: Examples: huge eyes that don't move; soft feathers for silent flight; talons to catch food; live in many habitats; different calls. Two facts from the passage.
10. B	Title B reflects the topic and tone. The others miss the focus.



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
