## Quick Review

The MAIN IDEA is what a passage is mostly about. KEY DETAILS are facts that support the main idea. The main idea is bigger than just one detail — it is the umbrella that covers them all.

### PART 1 — READ

Read the passage. Then answer the questions.

#### Why We See Lightning

During a storm, you might see bright flashes of light in the sky. These flashes are called lightning. Lightning happens when tiny bits of water and ice inside a cloud bump together. This bumping makes electric charges build up. When the charges get strong enough, they jump as a flash of lightning.

Lightning can flash from one cloud to another, or from a cloud all the way down to the ground. A bolt of lightning is much hotter than the surface of the sun, even though it lasts less than a second. Thunder is the sound the hot air makes when lightning heats it up so fast that the air bursts apart.

Lightning is beautiful, but it can also be dangerous. When you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to be a danger. Going inside a building or a car helps keep people safe. Tall trees and open fields are not safe places during a storm.

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Explanations	
<b>1. B</b>	B covers the whole passage — what lightning is, what it does, and how to stay safe. A is one detail. C is not in the text. D is the opposite of what the text says.
<b>2. C</b>	Very high heat supports the danger idea. A and B describe lightning but don't show danger. D is about how lightning starts, not danger.
<b>3. C</b>	C is one specific fact about thunder. The others sound like main-idea statements.
<b>4. A</b>	Paragraph 1 is the “what is lightning?” paragraph. B is paragraph 3, C is in paragraph 2, D is one small detail.
<b>5. B</b>	Paragraph 3 is mainly about safety. A and C are not the focus, and D twists a detail into something else.
<b>6.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Examples: “Electric charges build up.” “Charges jump as a flash of lightning.” “Lightning can flash from one cloud to another.” Two facts about charges or electrical jumps.
<b>7. B</b>	A summary captures the WHOLE passage. A and C and D each only cover one part.
<b>8. B</b>	Very high heat supports the “dangerous” point. The other choices are not what the heat detail is about.
<b>9. B</b>	Paragraph 3 names buildings and cars as safe; trees and open fields as unsafe.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: Lightning is a powerful flash of electricity that can be beautiful but also dangerous, so people should go inside during a storm. Any sentence that captures the “what lightning is + danger + safety” combination.



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
