Quick Review

An opinion piece TELLS what you think and gives REASONS. A strong opinion has four parts: (1) clear opinion sentence, (2) good reasons, (3) linking words (because, also, for example), and (4) a closing sentence.

Explanations	
1. C	"Best" is an opinion word — it tells what someone thinks. A, B, D are facts that can be checked.
2. B	B explains WHY the writer holds the opinion. A is a detail; C changes the topic; D is a fact, not a reason.
3. C	"Because" links a claim with a reason. The other words signal contrast, result, or time.
4. B	A closing sums up the opinion with strong wording. A is too vague; C delays; D states a fact instead of restating opinion.
5. B	After saying you have three reasons, give them. The other options break the structure.
6.	Answer: Example: I think art is the best subject in school. Any clear opinion sentence with the writer's view.
7.	Answer: Example: ...because art lets me show my ideas in pictures. Any reason that supports the opinion in item 6.
8. A	"Also" adds another reason. "But" contrasts; "before" is time; "even though" gives a contrast.
9. B	B is vague and does not state an opinion. The others all state a clear opinion.
10.	Answer: Example: (a) School should give less homework. (b) Because kids need time to rest, play, and be with family after school. (c) For these reasons, less homework would help kids learn and live better lives. Accept any topic with all three parts. Reason should support the opinion.
