## Quick Review

A SIMPLE sentence has one complete idea (independent clause). A COMPOUND sentence has TWO complete ideas joined by *and*, *but*, *or*, *so*. A COMPLEX sentence has one complete idea AND one dependent idea joined by a subordinating conjunction (*because*, *when*, *if*, *although*).

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Explanations	
<b>1. B</b>	B is one complete idea. The others combine ideas.
<b>2. B</b>	Two complete ideas joined by “and.” A is simple; C is complex; D is a fragment.
<b>3. B</b>	“Because...” = dependent clause + main clause = complex.
<b>4. B</b>	And is a coordinating conjunction → compound. The others are subordinating → complex.
<b>5. D</b>	Because joins a dependent clause → complex. The others are coordinating → compound.
<b>6. B</b>	B is missing a subject. The others are complete simple sentences.
<b>7. B</b>	Compound joins two complete ideas with a comma + coordinating conjunction. A is complex; C is complex; D is a run-on.
<b>8. B</b>	Because = subordinating → complex sentence.
<b>9.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: Pizza is my favorite food. Any one complete idea with a subject and verb.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: I like pizza, and my brother likes tacos. Any two complete ideas joined by and.
<b>11.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: I love pizza because it has cheese on top. Any sentence with a main clause + because + reason.
<b>12. C</b>	Although = subordinating → complex. A and B are simple/compound; D is compound with semicolon.



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
