Quick Review

Many words follow PATTERNS. Examples: when a word ends in a consonant + y, change y → i before adding -es (baby → babies). Double the final consonant when adding -ing (run → running). Drop silent e before -ing (bake → baking).

Explanations

1. B	Consonant + y → change y to i, add -es.
2. C	Double the final consonant after a short vowel: running.
3. B	Drop the silent e before adding -ing.
4. B	Consonant + y → change y to i, add -es.
5. B	Double the consonant after a short vowel: hopped.
6. B	Drop the silent e before -ing.
7. C	Adverb form: happy → happily (change y to i, add ly).
8. swimming	Double the m before -ing.
9. cried	Consonant + y → change y to i, add -ed.
10. B	Ride ends in silent e → drop e, add -ing = riding. The others don't follow this rule.
11. B	Stop ends in a single consonant after a short vowel → double the p.
12. flies	Consonant + y → y to i, add -es.
