Maya's Garden

Maya wanted to grow tomatoes in her backyard, but her mother said the yard was too shady. Maya did not give up. She walked around her house every hour for a whole day, watching where the sun fell. By dinner she had found one bright spot near the fence.

Maya carried buckets of soil to the sunny spot. She turned the dirt with a small shovel until her hands hurt. Then she planted three tiny tomato seedlings and watered them carefully.

Every morning, Maya checked her plants. She pulled weeds and gave them fresh water. Some days she sang quietly to them, because her grandmother said plants like company. By August, the bushes were taller than Maya and full of bright red tomatoes.

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Explanations	
1. B	Paragraph 1 says, “her mother said the yard was too shady.”
2. C	Paragraph 1: “She walked around her house every hour for a whole day, watching where the sun fell.”
3. B	Turning dirt until her hands hurt is direct evidence of hard work.
4. C	Paragraph 3 says she checked the plants every morning, pulled weeds, and watered them.
5.	Answer: Examples: walked around the house all day watching the sun; carried buckets of soil; turned the dirt until her hands hurt; checked plants every morning. Accept any sentence-level evidence of perseverance from the text.
6. C	All paragraphs show Maya working patiently — searching for sun, carrying soil, weeding, watering.
7. B	Paragraph 3 gives the reason directly: her grandmother said plants like company. The other choices give plausible-sounding reasons a kid might sing outside, but they are not in the story.
8. B	Paragraph 3: “the bushes were taller than Maya and full of bright red tomatoes.”
9.	Answer: Example: The story shows that Maya is patient / Maya enjoys gardening / Maya does not give up. Accept any inference supported by clear text evidence.
10. C	C captures the main events: finding sun, planting, caring, and the result.



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
