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Explanations	
<b>1. B</b>	Dictionaries give correct spellings and definitions.
<b>2. B</b>	Apple starts with A — earliest in the alphabet.
<b>3. C</b>	Catch starts with c-a-t-c, which comes after c-a-t.
<b>4. B</b>	Guide words show the first and last word on each page so you can flip to the right area.
<b>5. B</b>	Spell checkers flag possibly wrong spellings. Look up the right form.
<b>6. B</b>	Use reliable tools to check spelling.
<b>7. B</b>	Definitions are a core part of dictionary entries.
<b>8. D</b>	Compare letters one at a time: mole comes before monkey, moose, mouse.
<b>9. B</b>	Larger / online dictionaries have more words.
<b>10.</b>	<b>Answer:</b> Example: Look up the word in a dictionary or type it into a trusted online dictionary; check the correct spelling letter by letter; write it down in my spelling notebook. Any clear, step-by-step process using a reliable reference.



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
