

Classifying Two-Dimensional Shapes

A polygon is a closed flat shape with straight sides. The names come from how many sides there are: 3 sides = triangle, 4 = quadrilateral, 5 = pentagon, 6 = hexagon, 8 = octagon.

Polygon	Sides	Polygon	Sides
Triangle	3	Hexagon	6
Quadrilateral	4	Heptagon	7
Pentagon	5	Octagon	8

Key Concepts

1. A **polygon** is a closed flat shape with all straight sides. Curved or unclosed shapes don't count.
2. The polygon's *name* tells you the number of sides: tri-(3), quad-(4), pent-(5), hex-(6), hept-(7), oct-(8).
3. **Vertices** are the corner points where two sides meet. A polygon has the same number of vertices as sides.
4. A **regular** polygon has all sides the same length AND all angles equal.

Worked Examples

① A shape has 6 straight sides. What is it called?

 Six sides means hexagon ("hex" = 6).

 **Answer:** *Hexagon*

② Is a circle a polygon?

 Polygons must have straight sides. A circle is curved, so no, it's not a polygon.

 **Answer:** *No*

③ Name a shape that has 4 sides and 4 right angles.

 Four sides means quadrilateral. With 4 right angles, the shape is a rectangle (or a square if all sides are equal).

 **Answer:** *Rectangle (or square)*

Study Tips

-  Memorize the prefixes: tri-(3), quad-(4), pent-(5), hex-(6), oct-(8). They show up in lots of math words.
-  A polygon's number of vertices equals its number of sides. Both go together.
-  "Regular" means equal sides AND equal angles. A regular hexagon has 6 equal sides; a regular triangle is the equilateral triangle.

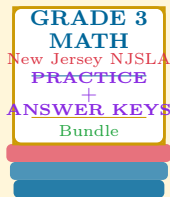
 **Answer:** *Regular pentagon*
