

Understanding Area

Area is the amount of flat space a shape covers, measured in *square units*. Count the square tiles that fit inside the shape and you have the area.

Key Concepts

- 1. Area** is the number of square units that fit inside a flat shape without overlapping.
- For a rectangle, $\text{area} = \text{number of rows} \times \text{number of columns}$ of unit squares. (That's where the formula $\text{length} \times \text{width}$ comes from!)
- For an irregular shape, just count the unit squares inside.
- Area is always reported in *square units*: square inches, square feet, square centimeters, etc.


Worked Examples

① A rectangle is covered by 4 rows of 6 unit squares. What is its area?

 Multiply rows by columns: $4 \times 6 = 24$. So the area is 24 square units.


 **Answer:** 24 square units

② An L-shaped figure is made of 8 unit squares. What is its area?

 Just count: 8 unit squares means an area of 8 square units. (Irregular shapes don't need multiplication — counting works.)

 **Answer:** 8 square units

③ A square has 3 rows and 3 columns of unit squares. What is its area?

 Multiply: $3 \times 3 = 9$. The square covers 9 square units.

 **Answer:** 9 square units

Study Tips

- ✎ For a rectangle, “rows \times columns” is the same as “length \times width.” Both give the area.
- ✎ Always include the unit: “12 square units,” not just “12.”
- ✎ For irregular shapes, count the unit squares one at a time. Make a mark in each one so you don’t double-count.
