## Quick Review

Capitalize proper nouns (specific people, places, things), the first word of a sentence, days of the week, months, holidays, languages, nationalities, and the first word of a direct quotation. In titles, capitalize the first word, the last word, and all important words — but not small words like a, an, the, and, or, of, in, to unless they begin or end the title.

### Explanations

<b>1. C</b>	'Aunt' is a common noun here (not used in place of her name), so it stays lowercase. The day of the week 'Tuesday' must be capitalized, and 'visited' is a verb in the middle of the sentence — it stays lowercase.
<b>2. B</b>	Capitalize the first word, the last word, and important words. Small words like 'of' and 'the' stay lowercase in the middle. A wrongly capitalizes 'The' mid-title; C wrongly capitalizes 'Of'; D misses the important word 'Secret'.
<b>3. D</b>	The holiday 'Thanksgiving' and the month 'November' are both proper nouns and must be capitalized. The verb 'celebrate' in the middle of the sentence is NOT capitalized.
<b>4. A</b>	Languages (Spanish, English) are proper nouns and are always capitalized. B forgets BOTH languages; C forgets one; D wrongly capitalizes the verb 'Speaks'.
<b>5. B</b>	Capitalize the first word of a direct quotation (Please). A forgets that rule. C wrongly capitalizes the verb 'Open' inside the quote. D forgets to capitalize the first word of the whole sentence.
<b>6. D</b>	When a family title is used IN PLACE OF a name ("I asked Mom..."), capitalize it. When it follows a possessive like 'my', it is a common noun and stays lowercase ("my mom").
<b>7. C</b>	When a quotation is INTERRUPTED by a speaker tag, the second half continues the same sentence — so 'be' stays lowercase. The speaker tag word 'she' is also lowercase because the sentence is still going. Capitalize only the first word of the whole quotation ('I').
<b>8. A</b>	Capitalize the person's name (Jordan) and the country (Canada). 'Friend' is a common noun and stays lowercase. B forgets the name; C wrongly capitalizes 'Friend' and forgets the country; D forgets the country.
<b>9. C</b>	In a title, capitalize the first word, the last word, and important words. The small word 'the' inside the title stays lowercase. A misses the FIRST word; B wrongly capitalizes every 'The'; D misses the important word 'Lion'.
<b>10. D</b>	'Rocky Mountains' is a specific place name — both words are capitalized. Seasons like 'winter' are common nouns and are NOT capitalized. A forgets the place name; B wrongly capitalizes the season; C only capitalizes half of the place name.



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
