Explanations

1. A	'Too' = very/excessively (too tired); 'to' is part of the infinitive (to walk). B reverses them. C uses the number 'two' in slot 1. D wrongly puts the number 'two' where the infinitive marker belongs.
2. B	'Two' = the number 2 (two cookies); 'too' = also (also more). A swaps them. C puts 'to' where the number belongs. D puts the direction word 'to' where 'also' belongs.
3. C	Slot 1: 'to' = direction (to the park). Slot 2: 'to' = infinitive marker (to play). A puts 'too' = also where the infinitive belongs. B reverses both. D uses the number 'two' for direction.
4. D	'They're' = 'they are' — fits 'they are going'. 'Their' = possessive (needs a noun: 'their game'). 'There' = a place. 'There's' = 'there is' — doesn't agree with a plural going.
5. A	'Their' = belonging to them (their coats). 'There' = a place. 'They're' = they are. 'There's' = there is. Only 'their' shows possession of the coats.
6. B	'There' = a place ('over there'). 'Their' would need a noun afterward; 'they're' = they are; 'there's' = there is — none fit the meaning 'in that place'.
7. C	'You're' = 'you are' — fits 'you are the best speller'. 'Yours' is a possessive pronoun ('the book is yours') and can't start this sentence. 'Your' needs a noun after it. 'Your's' is not a real word in English.
8. D	'Your' = possessive before a noun (your jacket). 'You're' = you are (makes no sense before 'jacket'). 'Yours' is a standalone possessive and shouldn't come before a noun. 'Your's' is not a real word.
9. A	'Its' = possessive (its tail). 'It's' = it is (the puppy chased 'it is tail' — doesn't work). 'Its' is not a real word. 'It is' is the expanded form of 'it's' and produces the same broken meaning.
10. B	'Then' = next in time (first homework, THEN play); 'than' = used to compare two things (slower THAN a rabbit). A swaps them; C uses 'then' for the comparison (a real error); D uses 'than' for the time word (also a real error).
