Quick Review

Many English words come from **Greek** and **Latin**. Useful roots: **tele-** = far, **photo-** = light, **port** = carry, **dict** = say, **scope** = see, **graph** = write/record, **bio** = life, **geo** = earth, **struct** = build, **aud** = hear, **vid/vis** = see, **spect** = look, **mit/miss** = send. Prefixes: **sub-** under, **trans-** across, **pre-** before, **inter-** between, **super-** above, **anti-** against, **re-** again, **un-** not.

Use the roots and affixes to choose the best meaning. Every wrong answer is a real meaning of another root — only one matches the roots in the target word.

- tele-* means **far** and *scope* means **to see**. What does **telescope** most likely mean?
 - A tool that records light onto paper
 - A tool used to see things that are far away
 - A tool that sends a signal across distance
 - A tool used to listen for distant sounds
- photo-* means **light** and *graph* means **to write or record**. What does **photograph** mean?
 - A written report about a famous person
 - A long-distance message sent through wires
 - A tool used to see something very far away
 - A picture made by recording light on paper
- port* means **to carry**. Which word means **able to be carried**?
 - import (carry in goods from another country)
 - portable (easy to carry from place to place)

- dict* means **to say**. What does **predict** mean?
 - To say before something happens
 - To say something loudly to a crowd
 - To say back what someone else said
 - To say that something is forbidden

Explanations	
1. B	tele- (far) + scope (see) = a far-seeing tool. A confuses <i>photo</i> + <i>graph</i> ; C confuses with <i>tele</i> + <i>mit</i> (send across); D confuses <i>scope</i> (see) with <i>aud</i> (hear).
2. D	photo (light) + graph (record) = a light-recording = a picture. A is <i>bio</i> + <i>graph</i> ; B is a <i>telegram</i> (tele- + gram); C is a <i>telescope</i> .
3. B	All four are real <i>port</i> (carry) words. Portable = port + -able = able to be carried. The others use <i>port</i> too, but their meanings have drifted: <i>import</i> = carry in; <i>report</i> = carry back (information); <i>support</i> = carry from under.
4. A	pre- (before) + dict (say) = to say before = a prediction. B is closer to <i>proclaim</i> ; C is closer to <i>repeat</i> ; D is closer to <i>forbid</i> or <i>prohibit</i> .
5. C	con- (with/together) + struct (build) = build together. A is <i>destruct</i> ; B is <i>transmit</i> (trans + mit); D is <i>inspect</i> (in + spect).
6. D	bio (life) + graph (write) = written life story. A is <i>geology</i> (geo-); B is <i>photograph</i> (photo-); C is <i>audiograph</i> (aud-).
7. C	geo (earth) + -logy (study) = the study of the earth. A is <i>biology</i> (bio-); B is closer to <i>philology</i> or <i>graph-</i> ; D is <i>astronomy</i> (astro-).
8. B	sub- = under; a submarine travels under the sea. The other choices each name another prefix's meaning.
9. D	trans- = across; transport = carry across. The others are real words but use prefixes meaning before, not, or again.
10. A	Row A is correct: <i>aud</i> = hear, <i>spect</i> = look, <i>inter-</i> = between, <i>anti-</i> = against. Use these to crack new words: <i>audience</i> (a group that HEARS), <i>inspect</i> (to LOOK into), <i>interact</i> (to act BETWEEN people), <i>antifreeze</i> (AGAINST freezing). The other rows swap each meaning with a real meaning of a different root or prefix, so every wrong row looks plausible if you mix them up.
