Explanations	
<b>1. B</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>bark</i> . Context: the dog made the sound — meaning B. A is the tree meaning (used as a noun for tree-skin); C is a kind of small boat; D is bark used as a verb meaning to shout orders.
<b>2. A</b>	Context: peeled off a log = the tree's outer covering, meaning A. B is the dog-sound; C is the verb meaning shout; D is the sailing-ship meaning.
<b>3. C</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>bat</i> . Context: <i>swooped + cave + night</i> points to the animal — meaning C. A is the baseball stick; B is <i>bat</i> as in <i>bat an eyelid</i> ; D is the verb meaning to swat.
<b>4. A</b>	Context: <i>swung + home run</i> = baseball, meaning A. B is the animal; C is the verb form; D is the eyelid meaning.
<b>5. B</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>ring</i> . Phones make a sound — meaning B. A is jewelry; C is the boxing area; D is a circular gathering of people.
<b>6. D</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>light</i> . <i>Turn on + dark</i> = a lamp, meaning D. A describes weight; B describes color; C describes difficulty.
<b>7. A</b>	Context: <i>carry it all day</i> = weight, meaning A. B is a lamp; C is difficulty; D is color.
<b>8. D</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>watch</i> . Context: caring for a sibling = meaning D. A is the noun for a wristwatch; B is staring (close to but more limited than D); C is a guard period.
<b>9. C</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>present</i> . Birthday = a gift, meaning C. A is the adjective ( <i>students present in class</i> ); B is the verb ( <i>to present a report</i> ); D is the noun meaning <i>now</i> .
<b>10. D</b>	All four are real meanings of <i>scales</i> . On a fish = meaning D. A is the weighing tool ( <i>bathroom scales</i> ); B is the music meaning ( <i>practice your scales</i> ); C is the verb ( <i>scaled the cliff</i> ).
