Quick Review

When you use more than one adjective, English follows a special order: Opinion – Size – Age – Shape – Color – Origin – Material – Purpose, then the noun. Example: 'a beautiful old wooden bench'.

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Explanations	
1. B	Order: opinion (beautiful) → age (old) → material (wooden). All four use the SAME adjectives — only the order changes. B is the only one that follows OSASCOMP.
2. A	Size (small) comes before color (red). B reverses size/color; C puts adjectives after the noun (wrong in English); D places 'a' between two adjectives.
3. C	Opinion (friendly) → age (young) → origin (Italian). A puts age before opinion; B starts with origin; D puts origin before age.
4. D	Size (big) comes before shape (round). A reverses size/shape; B puts an adjective after the noun; C places 'a' after 'big'.
5. A	Opinion (soft) → color (white) → material (cotton). B starts with color; C starts with material; D puts material before color.
6. B	Size (long) → age (old) → origin (Italian) → material (wooden). The other three scramble the size, age, origin, and material slots.
7. C	Number (two) → size (tiny) → color (black). A swaps size and color; B puts size before the number; D leads with color.
8.	Answer: shiny small metal Opinion (shiny) → size (small) → material (metal). Accept: 'shiny small metal'. Common wrong orders and the rule they break: 'small shiny metal' (size before opinion); 'metal small shiny' (material leads); 'shiny metal small' (size after material).
9. D	Age (brand-new) → color (blue) → material (plastic). A puts material before color; B leads with color; C leads with material.
10. False	Correct order is opinion → size → color: 'an ugly big green frog'.



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
