Quick Review

When you are not sure how to spell a word, use a reference: a dictionary, glossary, thesaurus, or spell-checker. Dictionary entries are in alphabetical order. GUIDE WORDS at the top of each page show the FIRST and LAST entry on that page — a word fits on the page only if it falls alphabetically between them. An entry also gives a pronunciation respelling (dots show syllables; the mark ' shows the stressed syllable) and may list more than one meaning.

8. A dictionary entry begins: hum·ble (h■m'bl). The mark ' after 'h■m' means:

9. You see the word 'mint' in a book about money: 'The coins came straight from the mint.' Which dictionary meaning of 'mint' fits this sentence?

Explanations

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| 1. D | Guide words at the top of a dictionary page show the FIRST and LAST entry on that page, so you can tell at a glance whether your word is on that page. |
| 2. B | Compare the third letter: 'magnet' has g, 'marble' has r. A word fits on the page only if its third letter is between g and r. 'Many' (m-a-n) fits because n is between g and r. A 'machine' (mac) comes BEFORE 'magnet'; C 'mask' (mas) comes AFTER 'marble'; D 'meadow' (me-) comes much later in the dictionary. |
| 3. A | All four words start with 'p', so compare the SECOND letter: a (paper), e (pencil), i (picture), o (pond). Order: paper, pencil, picture, pond. |
| 4. C | Compare letter by letter: peach (pe-a), pencil (pe-n-c), penguin (pe-n-g), people (pe-o). 'Pencil' comes before 'penguin' because c (3) comes before g (7). 'People' comes last because 'o' comes after 'n'. |
| 5. B | The dots in a pronunciation respelling separate SYLLABLES. 'ad-ven-ture' has three syllables (ad-VEN-ture). |
| 6. D | 'Celebrate' (cele) falls alphabetically between 'ceiling' (ceil) and 'cement' (ceme). A and B come before celebrate (cab, can come before cel); C comes after (cher after cel). |
| 7. A | Use CONTEXT clues: 'the player swung' tells you the bat is a piece of sports equipment, not an animal. |
| 8. C | The mark ' in a pronunciation respelling shows which syllable is STRESSED — the one you say a little louder and stronger (HUM-bul). |
| 9. B | Use CONTEXT: 'coins came straight from the mint' points to the meaning 'a place where coins are made.' The other meanings of 'mint' do not fit the sentence. |
| 10. A | A thesaurus lists synonyms (and antonyms). A dictionary gives spellings and meanings; an atlas has maps; an encyclopedia has articles about topics. |



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
