

# Solving Linear Equations in One Variable

## Q Quick Review

To **solve a linear equation** means to find the value of the variable that makes both sides equal. The golden rule: whatever you do to one side, do to the *other* side too, so the equation stays balanced. The usual plan is to **undo operations in reverse** — first add or subtract to move constants, then multiply or divide to peel off the coefficient. If the variable appears on both sides, gather the variable terms on one side first. Always *check* by substituting your answer back in.

◇ **Example:** Solve  $5x - 7 = 3x + 9$ .

⇒ The variable shows up on both sides, so step one is to get all the  $x$ 's together. Subtract  $3x$  from each side: that leaves  $2x - 7 = 9$ . Now it's a familiar two-step equation. Undo the subtraction by adding 7 to both sides:  $2x = 16$ . Finally undo the multiplication by dividing both sides by 2:  $x = 8$ . Quick check:  $5(8) - 7 = 33$  and  $3(8) + 9 = 33$  — they match, so  $x = 8$  is correct.

**Answer:**  $x = 8$

| <p>1. Subtract 6 from both sides: <math>x = 8</math>.</p> <p>2. Add 9 to both sides: <math>x = 13</math>.</p> <p>3. Divide both sides by 3: <math>x = 9</math>.</p> <p>4. Multiply both sides by 4: <math>x = 24</math>.</p> <p>5. Subtract 5 to get <math>2x = 12</math>, then divide by 2: <math>x = 6</math>.</p> <p>6. Add 3 to get <math>4x = 24</math>, then divide by 4: <math>x = 6</math>.</p> <p>7. Subtract 2 to get <math>7x = 28</math>, then divide by 7: <math>x = 4</math>.</p> <p>8. Add 8 to get <math>6x = 18</math>, then divide by 6: <math>x = 3</math>.</p> <p>9. Subtract 3 to get <math>\frac{x}{2} = 8</math>, then multiply by 2: <math>x = 16</math>.</p> <p>10. Subtract 4x: <math>x + 4 = 12</math>, then subtract 4: <math>x = 8</math>.</p> <p>11. Subtract 6x: <math>2x - 5 = 7</math>, add 5: <math>2x = 12</math>, so <math>x = 6</math>.</p> <p>12. Subtract 5x: <math>4x + 1 = 25</math>, subtract 1: <math>4x = 24</math>, so <math>x = 6</math>.</p> <p>13. Distribute: <math>3x + 12 = 21</math>, subtract 12: <math>3x = 9</math>, so <math>x = 3</math>.</p> <p>14. Distribute: <math>2x - 10 = 8</math>, add 10: <math>2x = 18</math>, so <math>x = 9</math>.</p> | <p>15. Distribute: <math>8x + 4 = 36</math>, subtract 4: <math>8x = 32</math>, so <math>x = 4</math>.</p> <p>16. Subtract 3x: <math>7x - 7 = 14</math>, add 7: <math>7x = 21</math>, so <math>x = 3</math>.</p> <p>17.
